East High School will administer the PSAT/NMSQT to all 10th and 11th grade students on October 12th and the PSAT8/9 to all 9th grade students on October 13th. By taking these exams, students will gain information regarding their readiness for college, have access to scholarships, and practice for the SAT. As a practice test, the fall administration will allow for plenty of time for intervention when a student is identified as needing extra support leading up to other standardized tests and ultimately college or careers. Students will be assigned to test rooms based on their grade level in Infinite Campus and will receive an email about their room assignments the week before testing.

Wednesday Oct 12

- All 10th and 11th grade students will take PSAT/NMSQT.
- Students should plan to arrive at 8:00 am.
- Testing will end around 12:00 pm. End times may vary by testing room.
- There will be no school for 9th and 12th grade students.

Thursday Oct 13

- All 9th grade students will take PSAT8/9.
- Students should plan to arrive at 8:00 am.
- Testing will end around 11:10 am. End times may vary by testing room.
- There will be no school for 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students.

East High School Skilled Trades Career Fair on October 27

Is your student interested in building, fixing, and maintaining? Are they good at using their hands and tools and moving their bodies? Interested in machines, structures, public safety, or medicine? Maybe seeking alternatives to four-year college? Then your student should check out the **East High School Skilled Trades Career Fair on October 27.** Here, students will learn the benefits of apprenticeships in the trades: full employment with a living wage and health/dental benefits and mentorship at 18, and debt free graduation, after which they will make between \$40-\$80k - all before they turn 25! They will then rotate through four skilled trades breakout sessions and get 1:1 time with presenters to discuss next steps. College Rep Visits

Please note that your student must be signed up to attend and they are responsible for communicating with their teacher ahead of time and making up for any missed work or instruction.

Advisement at Home

This week in advisement, each class was able to participate in multiple surveys which assessed social and emotional functioning and equitable grading policies. Students were also able to participate in a survey from the district to help better understand students' experiences at school and with staff. We believe these surveys will allow the school and district to better serve the students and meet their social, emotional and academic needs.

Continuing the Conversation at Home

Ask your student about equitable grading policies. Can they explain to you what these are? Do they feel that the grading system is fair and helpful in their learning? Ask your student if there is a staff member at East that they feel comfortable talking to. Who are they and why?

Does your student know how to set up a meeting with their counselor or with clinic staff? Can they show you?
