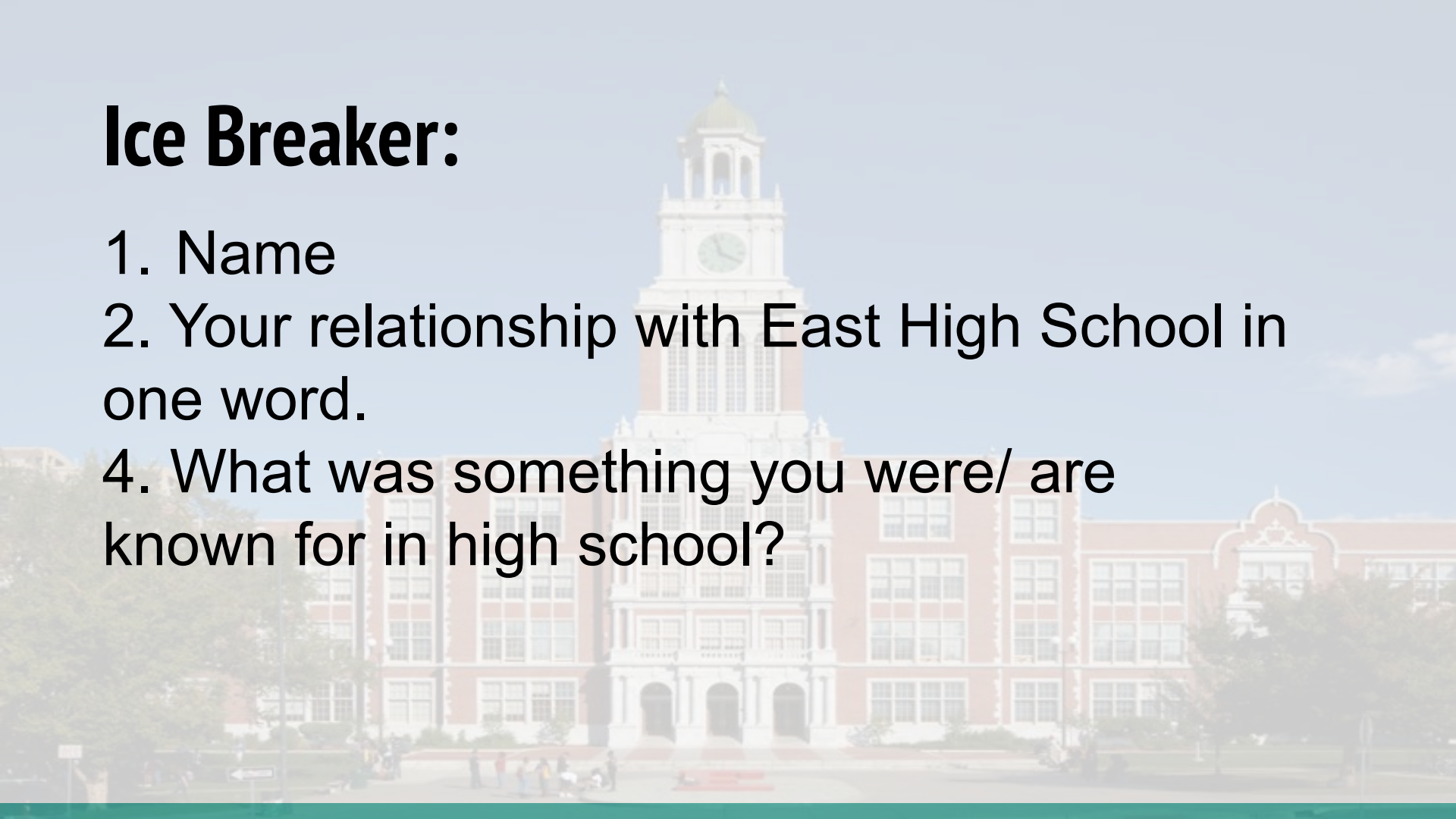

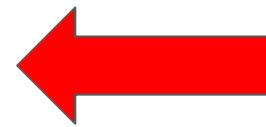

- Family Meetings (determining resources)
 - Includes parents and student. Should be in person or google meet
- Classroom Tracker
 - If you assign a classroom tracker, notify Raven and document.
- Attendance Contract
- Truancy- Only Heather and Adam for 9th grade not rollback 9th graders
- Legal letter Home- Only Heather and Adam
- Home Visit- 10+ days absent, students that are on the verge of being dropped

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Follow through

Follow Through:

- Each pairing will collaboratively work on the student attendance list that's assigned to them based off the counselor in the pair.
 - Seniors = counselor
 - 10-11 = deans/SEA and restorative
- Pairings can review interventions already attempted and decided next steps/complete intervention form
 - Complete the form with that intervention, document in IC Conference that intervention for was filled out
- Each pair must document their meeting outcomes in IC

Tier 3:

- Truancy if under 16
- Transition/Dropped
- 17yrs old can be dropped after 15 consecutive unexcused absence
