The Denver East High School community persevered through many traumatic events including four incidents of gun violence during the 2022-2023 school year. As the counseling staff, we saw students struggle with attendance and to achieve the academic success that they previously demonstrated. If there are any inconsistencies or drops in grades or anticipated academic performance, please, consider the context of last school year for our East Angels.

Academic Impact: Using data to look at trends, we saw a marked increase in D's and F's for the second semester of the 22-23 school year. Starting the year with less D's and F's than the year prior was promising. Those D's and F's almost doubled by the end of second semester compared to the previous year.
